<p>A. Safety Officer (AR 385-10)</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Safety officer has been appointed on orders.</li> <li>2. Safety officer is a commissioned officer at battalion or high unit level; staff sergeant or higher at company level.</li> <li>3. Safety officer has completed or is scheduled to complete a local safety course.</li> </ol>	
<p>B. Program implementation guidance (SOP, Regulation,. etc.) (AR 385-10 w/suppl 1; DA Pam 385-1)</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. The guidance addresses and implements the following:               <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. Safety training</li> <li>b. Safety inspection program</li> <li>c. Accident reporting and investigations</li> <li>d. Safety Awards</li> <li>e. Safety files and administration</li> </ol> </li> <li>2. Newcomer orientation covers the following:               <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. Traffic Safety</li> <li>b. Fire prevention</li> <li>c. Firearm Safety</li> <li>d. Hazards associated with assigned duties</li> <li>e. Miscellaneous (range safety, hearing conservation, flooded low water crossings, antenna safety, poisonous snakes, water safety, seasonal hazards)</li> </ol> </li> </ol>	
<p>C. Risk Management training and implementation (AR 385-10; FH Reg 350-1; III Corps Command Policy # G1-00-10)</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Safety risk management training is being conducted.</li> <li>2. Safety risk management is being implemented into all operations (i.e., exercises, special events).</li> </ol>	

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<p>D. Safety surveys (AR 385-10)</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Safety officers conduct periodic safety inspections of subordinate units.</li> <li>2. Action has been taken to correct deficiencies discovered during inspections.</li> </ol>	
<p>E. Accident Reports/trends/countermeasures (AR 385-40)</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Accident reports are submitted for all recordable accidents (resulting in one day lost time; and/or \$2,000 property damage)</li> <li>2. Accident reports are submitted within 14 calendar days.</li> <li>3. Files are maintained on accident reports.</li> <li>4. Trends are analyzed and countermeasures developed.</li> </ol>	
<p>F. Hazard Communication (HAZCOM) (FH suppl 1 to AR 385-10; 29 CFR 1910.1200)</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. A hazardous material officer (HMO) has been appointed on orders.</li> <li>2. A written HAZCOM program is implemented.</li> <li>3. HAZCOM training is conducted.</li> <li>4. A list of hazardous material used and maintained is available.</li> <li>5. Material Safety Data Sheets (MSDSs) are located for availability at all times.</li> </ol>	
<p>G. Respiratory Protection (AR 11-34; III Corps &amp; FH Reg 385-5; 29 CFR 1910.134)</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. A respiratory protection program POC (Officer/NCO) has been established</li> <li>2. A Respiratory Protection Standing Operating Procedure (SOP) is published for operations that require use of Respiratory Protection Equipment (RPE). SOP addresses how RPE is purchased, used, stored, and maintained.</li> <li>3. Applicable personnel are familiar with the Respiratory Protection Program and receive appropriate respiratory protection program training.</li> </ol>	
<p>H. Radiation Protection (AR 11-9)</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. NBC Officer/NCO is conducting review or tracking annual wipe test of CAM/M43A1. (NRC Licenses 12-00722-13, and 14)</li> <li>2. CAM/M43A1 are secured in a container properly marked with "Caution-</li> </ol>	

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<p>Radioactive Material” sign. (TM 3-6665-312-12&amp;P, and NRC Licenses 12-00722-13, and 14)</p> <p>3. NBC rooms are properly posted with “Caution-Radioactive Material” sign. (NRC Form 3, Section 206 of the Energy Reorganization Act, and III Corps memorandum, subj: Posting NRC Rules and Regulations, 9 Jan 00)</p> <p>4. Annual wipe tests are conducted on CAM/M43A1. (TM 3-6665-312-12&amp;P, and NRC Licenses 12-00722-13, and 14)</p> <p>5. Lost/damaged/stolen radioactive materials are immediately reported to the installation radiation safety officers. (III Corps &amp; FH Reg 11-9; FORSCOM Reg 385-1)</p> <p>6. Wipe test requirements for CAM/M43A1 has been incorporated into the ULLS-G system. (III Corps Chief of Staff Memo, 13 Aug 97, subj: Wipe Test of Chemical Agent Monitor (CAM) and M43A1 Chemical Agent Detector)</p>	
<p>I. Privately Owned Vehicles (AR385-55; III Corps Command Policy # G1-01-05)</p> <p>1. Personnel attend accident avoidance class.</p> <p>2. Periodic briefings are conducted covering the main causes of POV accidents.</p> <p>3. Motorcyclist are identified and required to attend an Army-approved motorcycle safety course.</p>
