

Major General Uberti is originally from Merrick, NY and was commissioned in the Field Artillery in 1983 upon graduation from the U.S. Military Academy. He has served in a variety of command and staff positions from Battery through Headquarters, Department of the Army level.

His operational assignments include tours with the 101st Airborne Division (Air Assault), 82d Airborne Division, 2d Infantry Division in the Republic of Korea, 3d Battalion 325th Infantry (Airborne Battalion Combat Team) and Battery D, 319th Airborne Field Artillery Regiment in Vicenza Italy, 18th Field Artillery Brigade (Airborne), the Joint Special Operations Command, and the International Security Assistance Force (ISAF) Joint Command (IJC).

During Operations DESERT SHIELD and DESERT STORM, Major General Uberti commanded Battery B, 2nd Battalion, 319th Airborne Field Artillery Regiment. He served in Operation ENDURING FREEDOM as the Director of Plans (C/J5), International Security Assistance Force Joint Command (IJC), and subsequently as the Deputy Commanding General, Regional Command East, serving with both CJTF-101 and CJTF-1.

Major General Uberti also served as the Fort Sill Garrison Commander, and subsequently as the Chief of Staff for the Fires Center of Excellence and Fort Sill, Fort Sill Oklahoma. He served as the Commanding General, Installation Management Command - Korea Region, and as the Deputy Commanding General-Support / Chief of Staff, US Army Installation Management Command at Fort Sam Houston, Texas.

His awards and decorations include the Distinguished Service Medal, the Defense Superior Service Medal, the Legion of Merit, the Bronze Star, the Defense Meritorious Service Medal, the Meritorious Service Medal, and the Army Commendation Medal. He has earned the Ranger Tab, Master Parachutist Badge, Air Assault Badge, Army Aviation Badge and the Army Staff Identification Badge.

Major General Uberti is a graduate of the Field Artillery Officer Basic and Advanced Courses, the Army Command and General Staff College and the Naval War College where he earned a master's degree in national security and strategic studies.

Prior to his arrival to Fort Hood, Major General Uberti was the Chief of Staff, United States Strategic Command, where he directed the activities of the US STRATCOM staff and served as the principal advisor to the Commander and Deputy Commander, United States Strategic Command.
